## 1. HEAR

Today is the Nativity of the Lord - Christmas season has begun!

It is a **Solemnity** – a feast day of the highest rank celebrating a mystery of faith.

You will notice that the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord has different readings for the different times of the day. If you know when you will gather for Mass, consider reading and praying with the corresponding readings.



You have had the opportunity to prepare during the Advent season for today! Think back and reflect on how each week of Advent helped you prepare to welcome Jesus in your home.

You can gather around the Nativity scene at your home or parish or, gather at a table. Invite each person to share what God is doing in his/her life.



Conclude with a prayer of thanksgiving for all the graces you have received. Each person can share a different prayer of thanksgiving, or one person can lead it.
